- **Survey Population**
 - OFRI small woodland owners ($N = 1,526$)
 - ODF Notifications ($N = ?$)
 - OWRI Respondents ($N = 121$)
- **Online Survey** (~20 questions)
- **Question Topics**
 - Awareness
 - Barriers to implementation/reporting
 - Incentives

Voluntary Measures Study



➤ Example Questions

- Have you ever completed a voluntary project?
- What has prevented you from completing voluntary projects?
(e.g., expense, complexity, etc.)
- What would be most helpful for you consider a voluntary project? (e.g., training, consulting help, financial help, etc.)

- Increased awareness and support of voluntary measures
